The diminishing number of priests is causing our church to examine how the sacraments can best be celebrated among us. In that regard, it is becoming clear in our area that the

anointing of the Sick should not be delayed unnecessarily as priests are not always immediately available in hospitals and nursing facilities. Interestingly enough, however, we are realizing that the anointing of the sick is not intended to be a sacrament for those at the point of death, but rather for all those who are seriously ill. This would include physical, emotional or spiritual weakness. Those who may want to be anointed may be entering the hospital or a nursing facility or undergoing serious testing. It is hoped that at the times of sickness, weakness or pain that this liturgical reminder of God’s presence and grace will be a comfort for those who take part.
