

Thank you to those who have continued to support St. Joseph's during this period of closure. Our income for the period March 22nd thru 31st amounted to \$3,893.50

and our expenses for the same period were \$5,568.83. Many of these bills cover expenses incurred prior to our closure as well as contractual expenses that cannot be changed. Please know that we have already taken measures to minimize expenses where possible (lowering of thermostats until it is possible to turn off boilers, suspend trash pickup & pest control). We would also like to report that we received \$334 for Catholic Relief Services which was the March 29th scheduled second collection.

Our mail is checked on a daily basis and donations may continue to be mailed to the Parish Office at 45 MacArthur Drive, Scotia. You may also consider checking with your banking institution to set up an automatic bill pay through your online banking. As always, your generosity is greatly appreciated.
