

All funds will be sent to **Catholic Relief Services** which will forward the donations to their partner on the ground, Caritas-Lebanon, to provide emergency food, shelter, medicine and more in the affected area. Donations may also be made directly through CRS at https://www.crs.org/. We would ask that you continue to keep the people of Beirut in your prayers as they begin a long rebuilding process.
