From the Pastor:

Twice today we hear Isaiah's directive: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." How are we preparing for the Lord to make inroads into our lives, into our hearts this Advent? What obstacles has our self-centeredness place in the way and how can we remove them? For what do we need forgiveness and what repentance can we make? As we prepare to receive the Lord in Eucharist or Spiritual Communion today, let us prepare to truly receive him in our hearts.

Preparing the way of the Lord is our Advent theme, and it is our invitation as our three parishes work together. To that end, I want to ask you to pray and ponder some things as we move forward. I am optimistic that we will forge a new path in the coming months. The charge offered by Isaiah is to prepare that way, to straighten that path, which right now might seem enshrouded in fog! Our Lady of Grace mass reservations can be made by calling 518-384-0109 with requests, or email mayerd@nycap.rr.com. Masses are Saturday at 5:30 pm and Sunday at 10:30 am.
